Top 4 Technology Upgrades for MA

MA residents want improved technology for their communities. Here is what they are calling for:

Computer-Aided Dispatch (CAD) software that pinpoints the exact location of the 911 caller

Modern Records Management Systems (RMS) that allows first responders to access updated, real-time information

Backup CAD which enables dispatchers to continue their work if their main systems go down

Mobile apps that let officers use their mobile devices to fill out reports and access information from anywhere
